LIBRARY NEWS Rachel Ip Author Visits

We are delighted to share the highlights of a wonderful learning experience that took place in our school library this week. Our Year 5 students enjoyed an engaging and informative author visit with Ms. Rachel Ip, an acclaimed children's author.



The session centred around Rachel's beautifully illustrated book, **Wild Crossings**, which provided a perfect real-world connection to the students' current Unit of Inquiry, "Sharing the Planet." Our Central Idea, "Creativity can increase the effectiveness of efforts to conserve the Earth's biodiversity" came to life as Rachel shared insights from her research and writing. *Wild Crossings* is also this year's Golden Dragon Book Awards shortlisted title in the Debbie Alvarez category.



During her interactive talk, Rachel covered:


- A bit about herself and where she finds inspiration.
- The concept of sharing our planet with plants, animals, and other living things.
- Our impact on habitats, with special connections to Hong Kong's environment.
- Why animals move (migration, seeking food/shelter).
- Case studies from Wild Crossings, identifying problems and creative solutions to man-made obstacles for wildlife.
- The importance of wildlife crossings for biodiversity and conservation.
- Insights into the roles of the illustrator and the research process behind the book.
- Examples of real-life scientists, ecologists, and conservationists creating innovative wildlife crossings.

The session was highly interactive, and our students were captivated, asking thoughtful questions that showed their deep engagement with the theme.


