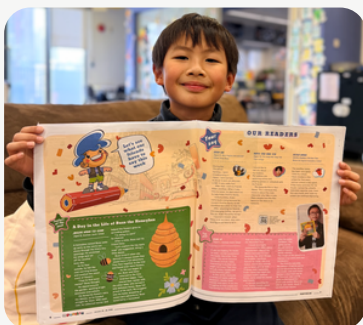
We are delighted to share that Rachel will be returning to KJS and has kindly agreed to sign books for our students. Further details regarding the book-signing will be shared once orders are processed.

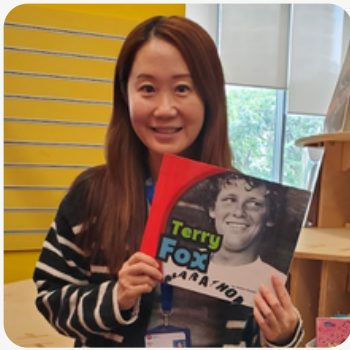

**Book:** Terry Fox by Jennifer Sutoski

**Ms. Lau** says: This easy-to-read biography captures the extraordinary spirit of Terry Fox, a national hero who was a defining figure in my Canadian childhood. Each September in Vancouver, our school would hold the Terry Fox Run, connecting us to his mission. Terry refused to let cancer define him. Even after the amputation of his leg, he pursued a bold dream: the "Marathon of Hope," a cross-Canada run to fight the disease that claimed him. His relentless optimism and courage are what I look up to most. Discover his inspiring journey for yourself.

## MESSAGE FROM THE SCHOOL NURSE

As we noticed that there is an increasing number of sick students with cold and flu symptoms in school, we really appreciate your help to maintain our school a safe and healthy environment! We would like to ask parents to check your child's body temperature and any symptoms before coming to school.

If your child display **any** of the following symptoms **the night before or that morning before coming to school**, please keep them home from school and after school activities and remain out until the symptoms have stopped for 48 hours (without the use of medicine):

- Temperature of 37.8 °C or higher
- **Abdominal pain, Diarrhea or Vomiting**
- Suspicious undiagnosed rash and/or itch
- Frequent, congested cough
- Yellow or green drainage from nose and/or eyes

It may indicate your child may be carrying something contagious. Allowing the children home enables children who are unwell to fully rest and recover and also prevents the spread of illness throughout the school.

It would also be appreciated if you can provide the detailed symptoms list with diagnosis and keep us updated with any other symptoms development when reporting the sick leave via our ESF Hub App.

For any diagnosed communicable diseases, e.g. Hand foot mouth disease, Scarlet fever, etc., please inform us as soon as possible to prevent spread of the disease.

Thank you for helping us to build a healthier and safer environment in our school.
